

Kathryn always dresses up for her presentations, and on this occasion wore an authentic 1880 maternity dress, which she described as being "well worn and fully adjustable!"

Kathryn has an in-depth knowledge of the history of Sarasota and her presentation was full of detail. Many of the audience went away with a better understanding of how Sarasota came about, and I'll never drive down any of the 'fruit streets' (orange, lemon etc – but not strawberry) without thinking of these fruits being exchanged in trade for Florida cattle.





Botanical

"Gardening makes us even in this world

February sure was a cooler month with light frost for a couple of days, but not too much damage in our gardens. We were busy cutting back plants, bushes and trees getting ready for the tenting of our building for termite treatment. The bigger job was moving all of our huge pots off of the sidewalk areas. The second biggest job was moving all the big pots back in place. It was a busy two Fridays and we workers were sure tired each of them.

Doing updating of the Woodland Garden by taking out many Bromeliads that were taking over the whole garden. Working hard to update the garden on the patio also, the Ferns and Bromeliads were taking over that little oval garden. Both areas are looking much better. Shared the plants we took out with all the volunteer workers.

We are getting more requests to do tours on Fridays with students from our local schools, and/or home-schooled children as well. Happy to do this also. Lots of visitors on Fridays now. The most asked question is always "What is the tall yellow tree?" Of course, that's the African Tulip tree that has been in bloom since November. Many of them want to take a picture of themselves standing under the tree.

We open up about 8:30a.m. each Friday & work until about II:00a.m. If you have time to volunteer, even if its once a month that's okay, We have water & snacks each week. We try once a month to have a Pot/Luck Lunch. or a Tour offsite & a Pot/Luck lunch or bag lunch.

March is Spring in southern Florida!

Danger of a freeze or frost continues past mid-month, so be ready to bring orchids inside, or cover them with sheets or beach towels if growing outside is better for you.

Having waited so long for the flowers we want to enjoy them as long as possible.

Water with Epsom Salts:

As colder weather can turn your orchid foliage a reddish colour; water them with an application of Epsom salts - one tablespoon per gallon of water is recommended. Water early in the morning as this ensures complete water evaporation by nightfall.

Re-pot in the right size pots:

Right after flowering is usually an excellent time for re-potting a plant; and the cool day-time Spring temperatures are hospitable to the orchid grower as well.


Remember – do not use pots that are not the correct size for what you are planting. Don't plant small orchids in large pots.

If you are dividing your large orchids remember to plant each of them in a smaller pot. Most orchids require a 4-5-6-inch pot, although there are seedlings and miniature orchids that require much smaller ones.

Older specimen plants (Cymbidium, Phalaenopsis & large Cattleya)

often require 8-11-inch pots.

Sidewalk Closed:

The northern sidewalk on Blvd of the Arts from Van Wezel Way to the west is closed and will remain closed until Phase I of The Bay is opened.

In addition, our new ADA-accessible sidewalk east of Van Wezel Way (alongside the Fountain Garden and Sarasota Garden Club) is open.

Temporary Closures:

Starting on Monday, February 28th Portions of the Mangrove Bayou Walkway and the pedestrian bridge will be closed for renovations, including the laying of rubber surfacing and the addition of new benches and etchings to the bridge.

Area Closure:

The south-western edge of Phase I, where the Tree Nursery currently stands, is closed for construction.

Parking:

If you're coming to visit The Bay, please use our main park entrance at the 10th Street roundabout.

There is plenty of parking available in the Van Wezel and Arts and Culture District parking lots.

CELEBRATING 60 PLUS YEARS Sarasota Garden Club's HISTORIC MID-CENTURY MODERN BUILDING 1959-2022

Over 60 years ago members of the **Sarasota Garden Club** took a leap of faith after much planning and fundraising and built our Mid-Century Modern building designed in the Sarasota School of Architecture in 1959 by John Crowell. It was beautiful and soon the gardens became a show place for our community.

After these many years our beloved building desperately needs some major restoration to return to her previous beauty and glory. Our goal to accomplish this is \$215,000 by December 2022.
