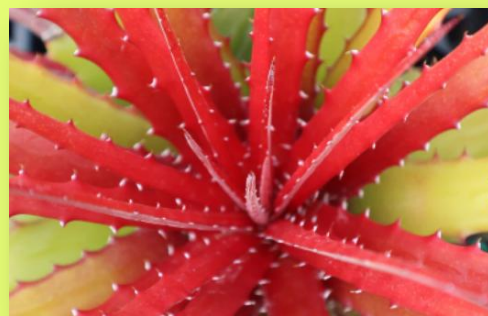

# Horticulture Study Review



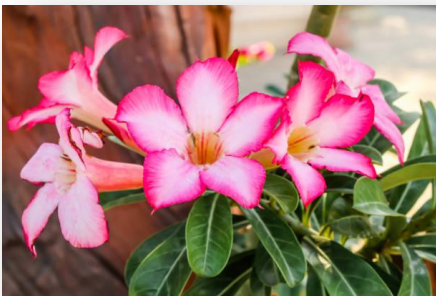
Our guest speaker for the Horticulture Study on succulents on 18<sup>th</sup> April was Ray Lemieux, owner of Red Island Plants: a plant store and captivating world of succulents.

After an initial introduction from Kay Weber, who has been a friend of Ray's for 18 years! Ray talked us through an impressive display of succulents, recounting a plethora of hints and tips as to how to care for and reproduce this type of plant, for which a "cat's whisker" seems to be an invaluable tool.

*"First off, **all cacti are succulents, but not all succulents are cacti.** Succulents are known to be moisture packed due to storage of water. Succulents store water in their leaves, stems or roots and the arms - thus they can survive quite a while without being watered."*



Ray recounted an entertaining story relating to Desert Roses – apart from the fact that they are neither from the desert OR any type of rose (it just seemed a nice name). He originally had terrible trouble keeping them alive. When he was working for a nursery, he actually killed nearly all of them and thought he'd lost his job, until the manager told him *"That's how you learn how to grow a plant!"* I think we can all sympathise with that!

**BTW:** Desert Roses like a LOT of sunshine and need to be watered a couple of times a week, and take a brutal pruning after flowering to encourage new branches and lots of flowers.

**BIG THANK YOU TO RAY**, who raffled several plants AND Members were able to purchase his wide-ranging and unusual selection of plants. To buy his plants – use his online shop or look out for him at local markets.

# The Conservation Foundation

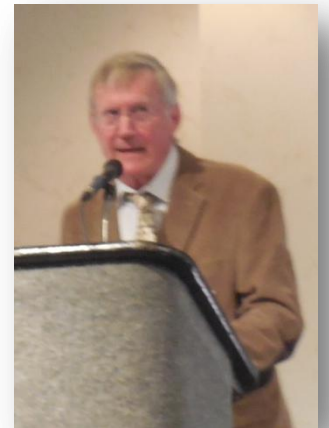
On Wednesday 20<sup>th</sup> April members were invited to attend the *“What happened to all the praying mantises?”*



We had a good representation of SGC, Dianne Beaver, CJ Danna, Elizabeth Moore, Andy Papanneau, Tess Herschman, and Anita Laesser.

Elizabeth Moore was the Presenting Sponsor for the Conservation Foundation at Michael's on East, a luncheon for the guest speaker, Dr. Jack Longino. The president, Christine Johnson, opened the lecture, and Elizabeth Moore thanked everyone for attending and thanked the generous sponsors.

A Sarasota native, Dr. Longino is a professor of Biology at the University of Utah. Longino is a passionate supporter of land conservation. A childhood fascination with insects led him to an interest in ecology and the desire to explain patterns of diversity, and settled on ants as an ecologically dominant group of insects worthy of study. He has written several papers on ecology, evolution, and conservation of tropical insects.

# Orchid Tips for May from Kay!

### ***May is a month of transition in southern Florida.***

- Early in the month we can expect the driest weather of the year. Temperatures rise rapidly in the late morning and can reach the 80's -90's by mid-afternoon.

Get your work done in the early morning before the heat comes in, especially if you are re-potting and watering, which should be done as early as possible in the day for best effect.

- Space your orchids properly for good air circulation. If your orchids are hanging on limbs, best to clear excessive foliage from trees / shrubs around them.
- **Reminder** - if re-potting your Phalaenopsis orchids, take them out of any sphagnum moss and re-plant them in woodchips, Perlite and a little charcoal.
- Water heavily early in the month, and more guardedly later in the month.

**For those of us who don't know:** A **Phalaenopsis** orchid (also known as a moth orchid) is a "monopodial" **orchid**, which means that it grows from a single stem with long, coarse roots, short, leafy stems and long-lasting, flat flowers arranged in a flowering stem that often branches near the end.

#### **Ode to Orchids, by YLZM**

**Orchids**, alien and other worldly; **beauty**, bordering the grotesque and bizarre, strangely exhilarating; **variations**, wild and uninhibited, even orgiastic, of a mind, as if, not of this world; **shapes and sizes**, folds and spirals colours and colourations. # Featured Plant: for Florida Succulent

**Tip from Red Island:** Ray Lemieux from Red Island says *"If I had to pick a succulent for this month it would be the desert rose because they are blooming right now, the colorful flowers and unusual structure of the plant have always caught my attention."*

This Adenium is quite an interesting cross by Mark Dimmit, master grower and breeder of desert roses. Mark has created thousands of varieties from seed, has named several dozen cultivars, and has written many articles on the subject. Be sure to check out the book *Adenium: Sculptural Elegance, Floral Extravagance*, which he co-authored and is a must read for desert rose enthusiasts.

With this cross, he combined several species to produce plants that he states, "will grow into monsters." There is a lot going on in this cross. Many plants exhibit foliage with the strong veining characteristic of *Adenium somalense*. The *arabicum* and *obesum* aspects in the cross produce a large caudex. The flowers range from pink and red to white picotee. Some flowers feature stripes in the throat that slide out onto the petal or white petalled flowers with splotches of pink and red.





# Scholarship

**The Sarasota Garden Club awarded \$39,000 in scholarships** to seven students from Sarasota and Manatee Counties this year from the Judith Schneider Memorial Legacy Scholarship Fund. This makes a total of \$339,000 over past years.

Our mission is primarily education. We award scholarships to area students who are majoring in a natural science and who excel in their personal lives and endeavours.

One of our awardees is already learning water resource technology and systems on a large scale.

Historically we have awarded \$10,000 a year, but this legacy gift allows us to award larger scholarships as the cost of education is increasing.

We are grateful to Judith Schneider for entrusting this gift to the Sarasota Garden Club for these students and future students who will be working to improve our worlds.

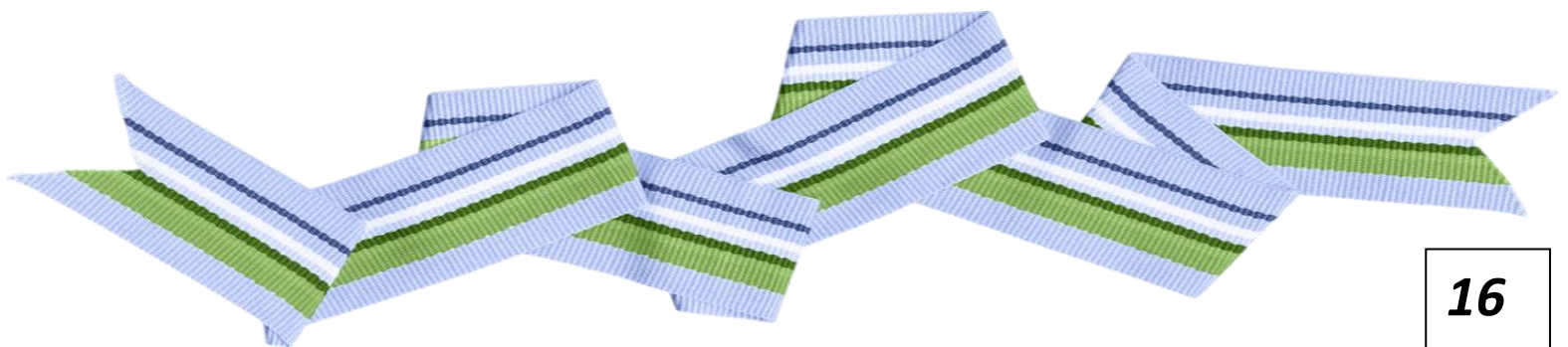

### Sarasota Garden Club's Historic Mid-Century Modern Building

Over 60 years ago members of the **Sarasota Garden Club** took a leap of faith, after much planning and fundraising, and built our mid-century modern building designed in the Sarasota School of Architecture in 1959 by John Crowell. It was beautiful and soon the gardens became a show place for our community.

After these many years our beloved building desperately needs some major restoration to return to her previous beauty and glory. **Our goal to accomplish this is \$205,000 by December 2022.**
