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President's Message

Greetings Garden Club Members!

Wow, March has been very busy and we just finished an incredibly successful "Gardens in Paradise"! It is hard to believe we are welcoming in APRIL already.



"Gardens in Paradise" (GIP) was a roaring success due to our incredible group of member volunteers. We received so many compliments from the attendees on the gardens, the vendors and the luncheon. Everyone truly worked as a team and put in such an incredible effort, and it really was evident on Saturday!

Thank you, thank you to everyone who made this one of our best "Gardens in Paradise" to date.

Thank you everyone for working as a team with such great teamwork! Everyone working together is the foundation for this successful tour!

The preparation for GIP takes many, many volunteers to enable such a large tour. It starts with the Garden Selection Committee searching throughout Sarasota and talking with homeowners about putting their gardens on the tour. It takes a lot of searching and discussion to sign up homeowners for this tour.

Next, we begin the advertising of the Early-Bird Ticket Purchase in October and running the advertising on social media, Facebook and Instagram. Then the website must be updated and prepared for both advertising and ticket purchases for the Early-Bird Ticket Purchases. While this is taking place, the Communications Committee begins the final drafts of the flyers, small cards and large posters for advertising around town. The Communications Committee also prepares print advertising and begins contacting several different publications seeking pricing and potential advertising donations. Advertising goes to print in February and March publications. Then the program must be developed, with the description of each garden, designed with sponsors and advertising, proofed, edited and then printed.

In the background, ticket and lunch purchases are taking place on the website with both the Ticketing Committee and the Treasurers tracking the counts and dollars.

While all of the above are taking place, the Logistics Committee is seeking volunteers and readying for the GIP Tour Day. The Logistics Committee is the frontline to all the GIP attendees on the day of the tour. They begin months before the tour understanding the location of the gardens, understanding the check-process and who their Captains are for the houses on the tour they will work. Multiple shift coverage is planned, parking coordinators learn the area and routes for parking. We also have a Docent team that is comprised of our volunteers and volunteers from the Master Gardner's. Wow, and we are still not done...

The Garden Committee gets very busy preparing the Botanical Gardens for "Gardens in Paradise" in the Fall and they work continuously right up to the day of the tour, ensuring the gardens look beautiful.

We also have our Hospitality Committee know as our "Kitchen Angels", who plan all the food, the floor plan layout, coordinate all the day's setup activities, do all the food preparation, serve the lunch for over 100+ people. When this is all done, they begin the cleanup for the entire facility.

So, while participating and learning about how and what "Gardens in Paradise" is, I am amazed at all the planning, coordination and work that goes into this annual tour.

Bravo, GIP Committees, a great effort, great results and another successful event!

TOP TIP - Visit DEEP HOLE - part of Myakka Park

Myakka River State Park has an off the beaten path hike where alligators like to congregate. This is so special that the park only allows 30 people per day to visit the area.

About 2 miles down a dirt road and without the help of any signs, you'll be confronted with a lush hammock of trees and a dramatic opening to what is known as "Deep Hole" in the 7,500-acre wilderness preserve part of Myakka River State Park. The spectacular view takes effort, but it's well worth it.



My (Becci) recommendation is to get to Myakka Park main gate early, explain to the Park Ranger that you wish to visit Deep Hole. Provided no more than 30 people have already gone, they'll issue you with a NUMBER, which is the entry code to a car park just a short distance from Myakka's main entrance (ON THE OTHER SIDE OF THE ROAD). So, once you've paid your dues, they've recorded the number of visitors in your party, given you the car park code, you're good to go. TAKE WATER, dress sensibly, with good walking shoes, and enjoy your once-in-a-lifetime wild trip! There are NO WARDENS so take care.


