

Education Committee – as well as the monthly General Meetings organized by Carol Lackey, which everybody has been thoroughly enjoying, Dianne has been acting Chair of the "Education Committee", and she has heard from members that they/we would like to see 2 events per month, <u>as well as</u> the General Meetings.

He immediately shocked us with this statistic: "that 50% of red tide is due to the nutrients that enter the water table from maintaining grass lawns". SHOCKING.

AND another key message: "HOAs cannot stop you planting Florida native plants" (Florida Statute 373.185). Check it out. INTERESTING.


His talk was full of interesting statistics and facts, as well as plenty of tips on how to achieve the motto "RPRP", and his use of PUNS was (what's the word?)

Landscaping Takeaways

- Use the right plant right place.
 - Soil, light, water, etc.
- If it's not native, not edible, not used, don't plant it!
- The state of Florida protects you from HOA's if you plant native, edible, o drought tolerant landscaping. Section 373.185 Florida Statute
- Flowering plants throughout the seasons not just everblooming.
- Plant multiple of each native, it encourages reseeding and promotes their respective wildlife.
- Remember your layers; trees and shrubs, flowers/herbs, groundcovers, vines. Turf grass is high maintenance and terrible for the environment get rid of it.
 - Numerous alternatives; mulch or pathways, mowed meadow, edible plants, mixed


