Christine P. Johnson is a fifth generation Floridian who shares the Foundation's vision for the human and natural words of Southwest Florida to flourish together.

After earning a BS in Business Administration from the College of Charleston and an MBA from the University of Florida, Christine worked in management and consulted with Fortune 500 companies in fields ranging from manufacturing to media.

Her Florida roots run deep though and this Manatee County native couldn't stay away for long. Christine has worked in our region's nonprofit sector since 2004.

She successfully completed the Girl Scouts of Gulf coast Florida's

\$7M capital campaign to build a regional headquarters and then served as Director of Development for Ringling College of Art and Design overseeing their largest fundraising campaign, leading a team of five to raise over \$100M.

In October of 2011, she was named President of Conservation Foundation of the Gulf Coast where she works to save land, ensure good land conservation public policy, and that all have access to natural places.

She is past chair of the Science and Environment Council, past chair of Visit Sarasota County, board member of Crowley Museum & Nature Center, past chair of the Partnership for Gulf Coast Land Conservation, vice chair of the Florida Alliance of Land Trusts, and on the national Land Trust Alliance Leadership Council. 

Featured Scholarship Recipient

This month we would like to showcase another of our scholarship recipients, Nicole Norwine (below). The "Friday garden workers" know her best, as she volunteers to work in the gardens when her schedule permits. Nicole worked on water projects when she was in high school, and continues to do so now in college. She is passionate about using water resources efficiently. We are so fortunate to have these young scholars in our lives. Our world will be in a better place because of their creativity, drive, passions, and intelligence. Our garden club is so proud to be able to help them.



Nicole's reply to my request of "what are you doing?" follows.

"I am in my third year of studying Chemical Engineering at the University of South Florida in Tampa.

I am concentrating on resource technology mostly in water resource technology through my electives, internships, and research opportunities.

I have worked for Tampa Bay Water, a government agency that supplies Hillsborough, Pinellas, and Pasco County, the City of Tampa, New Port Richey, and St. Petersburg, since January 2022.

I have learned so much about the industry I am looking forward to joining after I earn my degree and soon after my Professional Engineering (PE) License. I plan to work in resource technology and eventually work as a consultant to innovate and advance technology around the world.

In Spring 2023 I worked as a research assistant for a professor at USF on cellulose coatings for fertilizer pellets to eliminate the plastic coating conventionally used that leads to the leaching of microplastics in the soil and water.

I plan to continue my research from high school, which consists of advancing my prototype of an environmentally friendly and energy-efficient filter and overall system for desalination in the future. This would create an advanced alternative water resource with the planet in mind.

I am a member of the American Institute of Chemical Engineers (AIChE), the Society of Women Engineers (SWE USF), and the USF Botanical Gardens Club. Back home I volunteer at the Humane Society of Sarasota County animal shelter and the Sarasota Garden Club in my free time.

My college life mainly consists of studying, being active (nature walks, basketball, etc.), and my hobbies (gardening, sewing, reading, and music). My five-year plan for my career is to graduate with my bachelor's degree, possibly continue to get my master's degree, work in my selected field, acquire my PE, and learn all I can to eventually become a consultant and travel. If you would like more information please do not hesitate to ask. I am looking forward to coming back to volunteer during my breaks from school. I hope you have a wonderful day and thank you so, so much for everything you have all done for me. I will be forever grateful for all of Sarasota Garden Club's help and support, it truly means the world to me. Thank you!"

Blue Star Memorial Markers

Sarasota Garden Club maintains the landscaping around the bases of the <u>Blue Star Marker</u> and the <u>Doughboy Statue</u> in the JD Hamel memorial Park - highlighting Memorial Day and Veterans Day. This service is done in conjunction with the City of Sarasota. These sites are viewed as an important part of SGC's community services. Volunteers to help maintain are wanted. Co-chairs: Adrienne and John Wagner

In 1946 the National Garden Clubs embarked on its first nationwide project. Known as the Blue Star Memorial program, affiliated garden clubs across the country began erecting memorial plaques surrounded by attractive planting material along designated highways in honor of the Armed Forces of the United States of America. Over the last 70 years more than 3,000 Blue Star Memorial markers have been dedicated across the country. The first Blue Star Memorial marker in the state was placed at the foot of US 1 in Key West in 1949. Since then more than 200 Blue/Gold Star Memorial markers of the three authorized types have been dedicated in Florida along highways, at veteran's centers, at parks, at national cemeteries, and at many other civic locations.

Sarasota Garden Club Blue Star Marker

Located along US 41 East, on the Bayfront opposite Marina Jack just south of Main Street, Sarasota, **our** blue star marker was dedicated in 1959, honoring those who sacrificed their lives for our country serving in the US Armed Forces. This marker represents a worthy partnership between our club, the City of Sarasota and the National Garden Clubs.

Update from Adrienne and John Wagner:

"Irrigation around our Blue Star Memorial Marker is insufficient for most flowering annuals. Over the past couple of years, we have planted about 6 Dwarf Bougainvillea around the marker. These are doing quite well and survived Hurricane Ian Iast year and have survived the hot dry summer we have had this year. They do not bloom constantly, but are very colorful when they do bloom. They do not require major maintenance---just trimming to keep them growing compactly."

Thank you to John and Adrienne for continuing to maintain these important memorials.



War Memorial (Doughboy Statue)

The Doughboy

A bronze World War I soldier known as the "Spirit of the American Doughboy" was unveiled on May 25, 1998, in a Memorial Day ceremony. It was reproduced by Sarasota sculptor Frank Colson from an original created in 1920 by Ernest Moore Visquesney.



Update from Adrienne and John Wagner:

"Irrigation around the Doughboy Statue is adequate, however plantings there do suffer from winter cold and hot dry summer weather. We have planted a few Dwarf Ixora next to the marker to reduce the cost and the amount of work required to maintain the garden area. In addition to the Ixora, we have planted Blue My Mind Blue Daze around the outside and Dwarf Pentas in a center ring for color. This area requires more maintenance because of the need to replace plantings as they suffer from the weather and environment.



"Campers Today – Environmental Leaders Tomorrow."


