



Flower of the Month





"Lady of the Night"

I (Becci Bond) bought this orchid at the November General Meeting. It was recommended to me, by Elfi Espino, as one that would be good to have in my lanai for the 6 months I am in Sarasota, and then to go in my large oak tree when I leave. It smells terrific!

Brassavola nodosa, the Lady-of-the-Night Orchid, smells of citrus at night to attract a nocturnal moth. Their range in the wild includes Mexico, the Caribbean, Venezuela, and Peru – but now it's just off Stickney Point!

I've read all the instructions on www.orchid-care-tips.com and am delighted to read that "These are easy orchids to care for; it's no wonder they're so popular." (Things may work out well after all!):

- Give them warm temperatures to keep them happy. 75-80°F (24-29C) works well during the day, and there should be a 10-15°F drop at night (6-8C).
- Medium to high light works best for these orchids. Give them more than <u>Phalaenopsis</u> light, and up to as much as <u>Cattleya</u> light.
 <u>There will be red spotting on the leaves if the lighting is sufficient</u>; keep moving the plant to brighter spots until you see these. (But give it some shade if you see sunburn appearing.)
- Let them get dry in between frequent <u>waterings</u>. Use a very well-drained <u>potting mix</u>, such as <u>coarse fir bark</u> or wine corks, to achieve this. They are often <u>mounted on slabs of bark</u> to achieve the same result; this works well as they get more air to the roots as well, but they'll need daily watering. Fortunately, they look really attractive this way. It looks a lot like how they grow as epiphytes in the wild, and there's nothing quite like a big ball of leaves and flowers sticking out of a piece of bark.
- They can deal with as little as 40% humidity, but will be happier at 50-70% humidity. Humidity is especially important if they are grown mounted.
- They grow quickly with proper care, so you'll soon have very many flowers each time it blooms!



NATIONAL GARDEN CLUBS / FLORIDA FEDERATION OF GARDEN CLUBS / DEEP SOUTH REGION OF GARDEN CLUBS - DISTRICT VIII / SARASOTA GARDEN CLUB

As a member of the Sarasota Garden Club, you are also a member of the National Garden Club (NGC), along with thousands of other like-minded people whose mission is to promote the love of gardening, floral and landscape design, and civic and environmental responsibility by providing education, resources and networking opportunities for our members, youth and the community.

Belonging to SGC, we are members of the NGC, one of the largest volunteer gardening organizations, with federated clubs in each of the 50 states as well as the District of Columbia. NGC has developed and shared many wonderful opportunities that our federated garden clubs enjoy and share with members and the community. Check out the website at https://gardenclub.org/

- NGC is comprised of <u>8 Regions</u>, and <u>SGC</u> is in the "<u>Deep South</u>" Region of Garden Clubs (DS) which includes Alabama, Florida, Georgia, Louisiana, Mississippi, and Tennessee. <u>So as a member of SGC</u>, we are members of the Deep South Region.
- SGC members are also members of the Florida Federation of Garden Clubs (FFGC) which is comprised of 145 federated garden clubs and their 10,000+ members around the state. Our headquarters is in Winter Park and website is https://ffgc.org/
 - FFGC has 12 Districts and we are in District VIII which goes from New Port Richey in the north to Englewood in the south and as far east as Plant City. This includes 24 federated garden clubs totalling over 1,500 members.

Being a part of these organizations offers SGC a multitude of opportunities to help us fulfil our mission. Some of these opportunities are listed below:

- Blue Star Memorial Markers honoring our veterans and Gold Star Markers which support families who have lost a loved one in service to our country through the U. Armed Forces.
 - SGC has dedicated two Blue Star Markers: one in downtown Sarasota at Rt. 41 & Main St., and the other at the National Cemetery on Rt. 72. This program was started by NGC in 1945, and since 1949 Florida garden clubs have acquired 200 Markers, 8 of which are Gold Star Families markers.
- Education for members through NGC Schools including Flower Show, Gardening Study, Environmental Study and Landscape Design Schools.
- Three Annual Short Courses hosted by District I in the Panhandle, by District V with University of Florida in Gainesville, and by District X in various areas between West Palm Beach and Boca Raton.
- **Junior Garden Clubs** organized by federated garden clubs for youth in schools, churches, neighborhoods, Scouts, 4-H, etc., to introduce students to gardening, awareness of the environment, natural resources, ecology, conservation, composting, and recycling.
- Wekiva Youth Camp, a residential nature camp for 3rd thru 8th Grade youngsters sponsored by FFGC for the purpose of instilling a love and respect for the REAL Florida in our youth through nature study, conservation and protection of our environment for the future of our state and our planet. It is held at Wekiwa Springs State Park in Apopka every summer.
- S.E.E.K (Saving the Earth's Environment through Knowledge), an environmental conference for students entering grades 10-12 held at the University of Florida each summer. SEEK inspires student interest through field excursions and hands-on experimental activities at labs around the UF Campus.
- Besides the wonderful scholarships SGC sponsors, college scholarships for high school seniors and college students are also available through NGC, DS, and FFGC.
- SGC has donated to "Penny Pines", another NGC program, which partners with the USDA Forest Service to sustain our national and urban forests through this reforestation/forest education program. Collecting pennies adds to a \$68.00 club donation to help the replanting/ replacement of trees to a particular damaged area, whether by fire or by other natural catastrophes.
- SGC has also donated to Coral Restoration to restore and preserve our coral reefs for future generations.
- **National Garden Week** provides ways to communicate and interact with the community to promote gardening and encourage joining a garden club.
- SGC has participated in **Habitat for Humanity** homes with landscaping.
- NGC, DS and FFGC Awards are presented this year SGC received an NGC Flower Show Award for our "Garden To Table" Flower Show.
