

FFGC - Florida's Arbor Day Review

To observe Florida's Arbor Day, along with the 100th Anniversary of FFGC, approximately 150 federated garden clubs throughout the state of Florida planted a tree at a location in their community all at the same time - which was **11:00 am EST on Friday**, **January 19, 2024**.

We, SGC, held our tree planting ceremony at Oak Park School, 7285 Hand Rd, Sarasota, which is a school for special needs students from Pre-K to age 22.

Olivia Haynes represented Sarasota Garden Club, and this is a part of her speech:

"Thank you to everyone for coming and sharing Florida Arbor Day with Oak Park School and Sarasota Garden Club.

I [Livy Haynes] am the Florida Arbor Day Chairperson for the Sarasota Garden Club. I want to welcome Oak Park students, faculty, staff and parents, as well as Sarasota Garden Club members and guests.

Today is Florida Arbor Day, which has been celebrated on the third Friday in January since the year 1886 by planting trees in our communities.

I'd like to tell you a little about the history of Florida / Arbor Day. We celebrate it in January because most trees are dormant or not growing, so less water evaporates from their leaves. It is easier to transplant trees without too much stress during this time. NATIONAL Arbor Day is celebrated around the rest of USA in April. In celebrating Florida Arbor Day citizens are encouraged to help reduce air pollution, conserve energy, and beautify the state of Florida, by planting native trees.

The tree we are planting today is a Gumbo Limbo tree, which is a Florida native tree which can live 100 years and grow to 30-40ft high. It is also



known as the "Tourist Tree" because of its red peeling bark, which reminds us of tourists who stay on the beach too long and get a big sunburn, which then makes their skin red and peel. "

..... then she introduced Mr Daniel Beilman, the music teacher, and Oak Park students who sang for us. After the students had finished singing Mr Boesenberg (Mr B) and his students planted the Gumbo Limbo tree.

As well as Livy and Sue Angle, both of whom had made this happen, there was a good turnout from SGC club members – here are just some of them, others arrived later – and that's the Gumbo Limbo Tree (Bursera simaruba). The kids LOVED the name of the tree!





And here's a picture of some of the children, who entertained us so very well, and did a great job planting, mulching, stamping in and watering the tree – under the ever-watchful eye of Mr B!

Review of Field Trip to Audubon and Celery Fields



On Wednesday January 25th members of the Sarasota Garden Club met at the Audubon Society and the Celery Fields at <u>999 Center Rd</u> for a personal guided tour around the building and gardens, featuring Florida-friendly plantings, by Kim Sullivan and Pam Callender.



As soon as we arrived, we were greeted by a rowdy bunch of green parakeets (which are generally considered to be the naughty teenagers of the bird-world in Florida), flying by in flocks, squawking away. They are closely related to budgerigars, which remind me of my grandmother, who kept 'Percy' in her sitting room at home.

Right outside the Visitor Center there is an impressive bird nesting construction,



(left) made out of gourds (like the Indians used to make them) for the Purple Martins, who are annual visitors (right). They were very active, flying through the air with their mouths open to catch insects.

During the tour, several of us checked out the Bird Feeder area, where there was a plethora of both photographers and iridescent Red Winged Black Birds (left) and then we were lucky enough to see a brightly colored Bunting (right).

After the tour, we crossed over the road and on to the boardwalk that extends into a



large lagoon, from where you can see the wildlife close-up, and we saw: a large black snake, various ducks, moorhens, coots, and a vividly colored bird

called a Purple Gallinule which, according to the ornithologist on duty, walks atop the lily pads as *'it doesn't like to get its bottom wet'*. The guide was pleased to point out the less visible birds, lend out his binoculars to get a better view, and was full of useful and interesting wildlife facts.

THE BUILDING, FLORIDA-FRIEND GARDENS, BIRD FEEDING STATION, THE BIG HILL (apparently NOT made up of garbage, but soil that came out of dredging the lagoons), LAGOONS, THE WALKWAY, THE PEOPLE, AND NATURE – all make a really enjoyable visit.

Take a visit – it does have a gift shop but not refreshments – and **"Take a walk on the wild side"** – you can even hear the roar of the animals from the Big Cat Habitat close by <u>Big Cat Habitat</u> <u>– & Gulf Coast Sanctuary</u> so there's lots to make the trip a day out to remember.

Here is a high-level overview of the gardens:

Sarasota Garden Club's Gardens in Paradise Tour has an exciting array of gardens selected for 2024.

The Indian Beach/Sapphire Shore neighborhood (also known as The Museum District) is the chosen venue, where our patrons will enjoy seeing private and welltended gardens behind their walls, some along Sarasota Bay and a couple tucked into lovely mature tree-lined streets. Approximately two miles of Bay Shore Road running north and south along Sarasota Bay will be the back drop for this Tour. This neighborhood began its development in the early 1900's. As you drive through these adjoining historical neighborhoods of Indian Beach and Sapphire Shores on the north end, you will see it is filled with homes of all styles, large and smaller, with no cookie cutter looks. All plantings will be of mature sizes and select yards/gardens will have unique tree or shrub specimens.

The Tour Committee has found two <u>historical</u> homes/gardens with connections to the Ringling families. These homes and properties would have been developed during the 1920 and 30's. We will be explaining about these homes and their previous owners' connections when you come into their gardens. Understandably, their locations are relevant to the Ringling Museum and Ca' d'Zan.



We also had a table promoting our club, kindly manned by club members – here's Tom and Jim.






