


And our Hospitality Committee outdid themselves this year with wonderful food at each General Meeting and other key events, which everybody enjoys!

"Over the next month or two, while our gardens are looking especially nice, how about we **gather together at Members homes and have a tour**?


- You get to show off your hard work and beauty and we have a lovely morning followed by lunch at a local spot?








1927 – 2027 = 100 years!

Doughboy Statue

In Rev. J. D. Hamel Park near the South corner of Main Street and South Gulfstream Ave., across the street from the large Gulfstream Towers apartment complex (a sidewalk path leads from the South corner directly to the statue).

Our soldiers in that war were popularly called "Doughboys," and the statue's proper name is "Spirit of The American Doughboy."



The Blue Star was adopted because it had become an icon in World War II and was seen on flags and banners in homes for sons and daughters away at war as well as in churches and businesses.



Visit to Naples Garden Club's Flower Show


On Saturday April 6, Becci Bond, Ros Stafford and Angela Bennink took a day's road trip to Naples to visit the Naples Garden Club flower show, which was being held in the

Their flower show was entitled **"A World of Wonders"** which provided plenty of scope for



various focal points, interesting classes, decoration, flowers etc. e.g. "Taking the Train to RHS Garden Wisley", "Flying to Singapore Botanic Garden", "Going Upstate to Kanapaha", "Hanging Gardens of Babylon", "Marveling at Nong Nooch" Etc.



It was interesting to be a VISITOR at somebody else's flower show. We witnessed how the PUBLIC were a little confused by the sections, groups etc., and we were delighted to explain them while we were viewing. Ros was able to impart some insight in to how and why awards were given.

One Class that I particularly liked, is where there is a PAINTING and the entrants have to create a Flower Design that reflects the elements of the painting. The theme was "The Grand Tour" – there was the Eifel Tower, Egyptian Pyramids, and Venetian Canals – so you can imagine the shapes, structure, and colors that were involved. A LOT OF FUN TO DO I IMAGINE, and I'd like to see that included in SGC's Flower Show next year.

I (Becci) have experienced 2 SGC Flower Shows now, and actually entered a 'Table for Four' last year – I won 2nd prize, and was absolutely THRILLED. You need to GO to a Flower Show to understand what's involved. I'll enter again next year you shouldn't be AFRAID!

The Naples Flower Show is held in quite a large venue (part of the Botanic Gardens setup) and were able to hold live presentations, which were very well attended.

We were in time to see one demonstration of floral design - where each attendee was given a raffle ticket (free), and Ros was the lucky winner of a prize, taking home this wonderful piece of what, I am reliably informed, is known as

LEAF MANIPULATION.

Look out for the new Education Committee organizing a demonstration on this very topic.







Review of FFGC 97th Annual State Convention

You've been brought up to date on District and Deep South news in previous Blooming Chatters, so this month let me (Sue Angle) tell you about the 97th Annual State Convention that was held in Jacksonville April 11 – 12.

It started with the <u>Early Arrivals Pre-Convention dinner</u>, that always has entertainment, and this year it was hilarious and fun!

Because this Convention was celebrating the **100**th **Anniversary of FFGC**, each of the 12 Districts had 3 of their members dress in the fashion of the decade assigned to them.

Each District group paraded, danced and whatever they could do around the dining room to the music of their era. <u>Our</u> <u>District VIII was assigned the **'80's** and were a hit.</u>

One of the Speakers during the convention was **Laura Dowling**, who served as <u>Chief Floral Designer at the</u> <u>White House</u> from 2009 until 2015. *Check out this write up on Laura, her career, design styles, and books at* <u>https://www.theflowerpodcast.com/laura-dowling</u>.

Another was **Xavier Cortada** a Cuban-American artist who is based in Miami and, among many other things, pioneered eco-art in Miami with his <u>*"Reclamation Project"</u>*, a participatory mangrove reforestation effort, and was recently appointed by Mayor Daniella Levine Cava to serve as the inaugural Artist-in-Residence for Miami Dade County.</u>

NGC President Brenda Moore and Deep South Garden Clubs Director Debby Cooper both attended and brought us up to date on NGC and DS projects. Workshops included "Fun with Flowers", "The Future of Our Coasts", Creating Fascinators, Photograph, Native Plants, Gardens & Birds, and others.


