SGC and The Bay Park Conservancy Update



The Bay continues to work tirelessly repairing and improving the grounds and building at 1131 Boulevard of the Arts. Here are a few key points:

- The SGC offices (printer room, reception, finance office and library) all near completion by The Bay team. The rooms are now all in full use, enjoying new windows, flooring and decoration throughout. New blinds are imminent, and behind the scenes, work has been carried out on the Internet, electricity and water systems.
- A hard-working team of SGC volunteers has been working to clear, sort, store and clean throughout as work gets completed and SGC moves back in.
- The library books were removed after the hurricanes, have been in storage since then, and are now being reviewed before recreating our treasured store of knowledge – coming soon. Our Librarians are heading up this activity. New furniture is forthcoming, particularly shelving for the library books.
- Temporary furniture has been donated with a modern look & feel, and the library may now be used for meetings and must be scheduled.
- The Friday Morning Garden volunteers have returned to maintain the Botanic Gardens adjacent to the building. The Bay is organizing the repairs to the 'shed' and building roofs, and garden fences. Our Sarasota Garden Club sign on Blvd of the Arts has been fixed and stood up by The Bay.
- The Bay is in the process of reviewing plans drawn up by Landscape Architect
 Firm, <u>Kimley-Horn</u>, for the entire area, including the gardens which has grasses,
 landscaping and trees that can adapt and survive in our vulnerable area. The
 short-term plan focuses on replacing the damaged garden area during the
 planting season February/June.
- The Waterfall in our Botanic Garden was damaged during the hurricanes.
 Volunteers are working in and around it to make it appear nicer, but a professional has been contacted to schedule cleaning this out.

We will share more of the progress of the renovation of our perimeter gardens as the project moves forward.

JUDITH WOODBRIDGE SCHNEIDER MEMORIAL LEGACY SCHOLARSHIP

Judith Woodbridge Schneider, our member, left our club a large bequest which is invested with the large Sarasota consortium of not-for-profits active in the greater Sarasota area. Each year our club is able to use our investment as scholarships awarded to Sarasota County seniors who have been accepted at accredited universities to study Natural Sciences. Our committee takes the amount the Garden Club Board of Directors feels is appropriate and remaining funds carry over for the next academic year to fund new scholarships to be awarded to graduating seniors from Sarasota County.

This year \$60,000 has been approved for the Scholarship Program – imagine what a difference that makes to our young students in persuing such worthwhile careers?

The Scholarship Committee is in the process of advertizing the SGC Scholarship program to Sarasota County Educational Foundation which candidates know to approach. We shall soon be receiving applications for review, up until April 1st. Scholarships are awarded at an event at the club which is to take place on May 5th.




