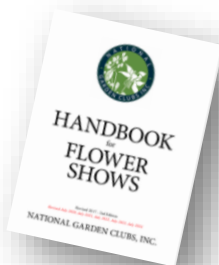

RHYTHM & Blooms – General Rules (HB pp. 24-25)

This Flower Show conforms to the standards established by National Garden Clubs, Inc. (NGC). *The Handbook for Flower Shows (HB) 2017 -2nd Edition* with revisions posted on the NGC Website, is the authority for all issues not covered by the schedule, which is the law of the show. The *Handbook* is available for free at www.gardenclub.org.



1. Competition in the **Design** and **Education** Divisions is open to all members of Florida Federation Garden Clubs, Inc. (FFGC) Competition in the **Horticulture** Division is open to amateur exhibitors in Florida.
2. All entries must be registered in advance with the appropriate Division Chair. See specific registration deadlines listed in the Rules for each Division.
3. All exhibits must be removed from Sarasota Garden Club on Saturday, February 21, 2026, between 4PM and 5PM. Any items not removed by 5PM will be disposed of without notice.
4. Refer to each Division's Rules for times entries can be placed.
5. Judging will begin at 1 PM on Friday, February 20, 2026.
6. Complete procedure for making entries is stated in each Division's Rules.
7. The Classification Chair for each must review all entries for proper identification and conformity to the schedule prior to judging. Final determination for conformance is the judges' responsibility.
8. The General Chair and the Classification Chair must be available during all judging for possible consultations. They, along with the judges and clerks, are the only personnel allowed on the floor during judging.
9. The decisions of the judges are final. Awards may be withheld if not merited.
10. There must be an emphasis on fresh plant material. NO artificial plant material is permitted in any exhibit in any Division.
11. Each exhibitor is limited to one entry per class, except in the Horticulture Division if each is a different species, variety, cultivar, type, or color.
12. The Sarasota Garden Club, Inc. will strive to assure the safety of all items after arrival and placement but is not responsible for loss or damage to exhibits.

13. Native plants may be entered provided such plants have been legally obtained and grown by the exhibitor for at least 90 days. Reference: <https://edis.ifas.ufl.edu/publication/EP297>
 14. The use of plant material classified as Invasive Exotic or Aquatic Invasive is prohibited. See the IFAS website at the Center for Aquatic and Invasive plants, <https://plants.ifas.ufl.edu/plantdirectory> for a complete list.
 15. The use of plant material on Florida's Federally Listed Plant Species as endangered or threatened is prohibited. 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RHYTHM & Blooms – Awards (HB pp. 24-25)

The NGC Standard System of awarding is used in all Divisions (HB Chapter 5, p. 39).

- **Only 1 FIRST PLACE (blue) ribbon per class or sub-class;** must score **90** points or more.
- **Only 1 SECOND PLACE (red) ribbon per class or sub-class;** must score **85** points or more.
- **Only 1 THIRD PLACE (yellow) ribbon per class or sub-class;** must score **80** points or more.
- **1 or more HONORABLE MENTION (white) ribbons,** as merited: must score **75** points or more.

RHYTHM & Blooms – Design Rules (HB pp. 28-29, 79-81)

All General Rules Apply.

1. The NGC Exhibit policies are printed in the *Handbook of Flower Shows, Chapter 7, Exhibiting in the Design Division, NGC Policies and Guidelines*.
2. Advance registration is required by Sunday February 1, 2026. Registration forms are available on the Sarasota Garden Club website or at the club.
 - a. Submit entry forms to the Design Chair, Dianne Beaver, diannebeaver@gmail.com.
3. Plant material and non-plant material permitted and not permitted in the Design Division are printed in the *Handbook for Flower Shows, Chapter 7*.
4. All plant material used in the design must be identified on a 3"x5" white card to be provided by the exhibitor and included with the entry card.
5. The exhibitor is required to conform to the stated descriptions and limitations of the design type if named in the class.
6. Rules for design types, advanced design types, table designs, and table appointments are printed in the *Handbook for Flower Shows, Chapter 7*.
7. Designer is on their honor that the design being entered has not been previously entered or judged in an NGC Standard Flower Show.
8. The Scale of Points for Design is located in *Chapter 14 of the Handbook for Flower Shows*.
9. Designs will be placed on Thursday February 19, 1-4PM or Friday February 20 2026 9-10AM. The Design Chair will prepare all entry cards for all design classes and give them to the design exhibitors on the day of the show.

Section A: "You Are My Sunshine"

 **Eligible for one (1) Designers Choice Award (HB p. 47)**

Class 1	<i>"Rain, Rain Go Away"</i> HB pp. 70-71	A traditional line design with a vertical pattern and great restraint in the quantity of plant material used. A linear pattern is dominant. Staged on a 36" high and 18" square top, clear acrylic pedestal. Background will be an off-white wall or draped off-white sheer curtain. • Frame of reference is 18" wide x 18" deep with no height restriction.
Class 2	<i>"Ring Those Chimes"</i> HB p 75	A creative design containing reflective components giving back images of light. These materials are an integral part of the overall design. Staging in front of a mirror is not acceptable. Staged on a 40" high and 18" square top, clear acrylic pedestal. Background will be an off-white wall or draped off-white sheer curtain. • Frame of reference is 18" wide x 18" deep with no height restriction.
Class 3	<i>"Symphony of Color"</i> HB pp 70-71	A traditional line design with a crescent pattern. A linear pattern is dominant with great restraint in the quantity of plant material used. Staged on ½ of a 6' table, 30" deep and 29" from the floor. Table will be entirely covered by black stretch cloth provided by the committee. Background will be an off-white wall or draped off-white sheer curtain. • Frame of reference is 6' table, 30" wide and 30" deep with no height restriction.

Section B: “Dance of the Flowers”

 Eligible for one (1) Table Artistry Award (HB p. 43).

Class 4	<i>“Breakfast at Tiffany’s”</i> <i>HB pp 76-77</i>	Tray for One Staged on ¼ of a 5’ round table, 26” from the floor, free standing for 360-degree viewing. Table will be entirely covered with black stretch cloth provided by the committee. Frame of reference is a wedge 29” on 2 sides with the third side a curved edge 46” long. No height restriction. Tray to be provided by exhibitor with dimensions not to exceed the frame of reference.
Class 5	<i>“Takes Two to Tango”</i> <i>HB pp 76-77</i>	A Cocktail Table for Two Staged on a free-standing high top, with round top, 25 ½” in diameter, 45” high. Table will be entirely covered with black stretch cloth provided by the Committee. Frame of reference is 25” wide with no height restriction.
Class 6	<i>“Do-Si- Dos”</i> <i>HB pp 76-77</i>	A Casual Country Lunch Table for Four Staged on a table 26” tall and 30” square and free standing for 360-degree viewing. The entire table is covered by a black stretch cloth provided by the Committee. Frame of reference is 30” square with no height restriction.



RHYTHM & Blooms – Horticulture Rules (HB pp. 27-28)

1. The NGC exhibit policies are printed in the *Handbook for Flower Shows, Chapter 6, Exhibiting in the Horticulture Division*.
2. The rules for a single species cut or container-grown specimens are listed in *Handbook for Flower Shows or its supplement, Horticulture Exhibiting and Judging*.
3. In order to receive an NGC Top Exhibitor Award, the exhibitor must identify their entry by its binomial name or currently accepted scientific designation. Consult *Handbook for Flower Shows, Exhibiting in the Horticulture Division, Chapter 6*.
4. Advance registration is required. Entry forms are to be filled out and sent to the Horticulture Chair Sue Angle at sueangle000@gmail.com by Thursday February 12, 2026. Entry forms are available on the SGC website or at the club.
5. Entry cards will be completed by the Horticulture Chair in advance.
6. Cut specimens should not have foliage below the water line except for *Gladiolus*.
7. If a plant is considered a flowering plant, it should be exhibited as a flowering specimen. Foliage plants may flower but should be exhibited as foliage plants if they are grown for their leaves.
8. Specimen with a class designation in the schedule may not be entered in the 'Any other worthy' class.
9. The Horticulture Classification Chair and/or the Show Chair are free to subdivide classes by color, form, size, cultivar, variety or other distinguishing characteristics.
10. The Scales of Points for Horticulture are located in *Chapter 14 of the Handbook for Flower Shows*.
11. Containers for cut specimens will be provided by committee. Wedging is allowed using cellophane wrap supplied by committee.
12. Exhibits are to be grown by the exhibitor.
13. Container grown entries must be delivered to Sarasota Garden Club on Thursday February 19, 2026, between 1PM and 4PM. Cut specimens must be delivered on Friday February 20, 2026, between 9AM and 10:00AM.

RHYTHM & Blooms – Education Rules

All General Rules apply.

1. The purpose of educational exhibits is to inform members and the public about the goals and objectives of NGC.
2. Educational exhibits may be the work of more than one individual or organization unless a Student Judge, or an Accredited Judge is seeking exhibiting credit for preparing an educational exhibit.
3. An exhibit must occupy a minimum of eighteen (18) square feet of surface area.
4. Each exhibit will be staged on a 6' and 30" deep table covered in a black stretch cloth provided by the committee.
5. Scale of Points for Educational Exhibits is listed in the *HB p. 130*
6. Exhibits are competitive.
7. Exhibitor to provide a niche (trifold) 36" high x 48" wide.
8. Some plant material is required.
9. Exhibits are to be placed on Thursday February 19, 2026, between 1PM and 4PM
