## **General Rules**

- 1. This Flower Show conforms to the standards established by National Garden Clubs, Inc. (NGC). *The Handbook for Flower Shows (HB), 2017 Edition, with revisions printed in the National Gardener* magazine is the authority for all issues not covered by the Flower Show Schedule, which is the Law of the Show.
- 2. There must be an emphasis on FRESH plant material. NO artificial plant material is permitted in any exhibit, in any division.
- 3. Competition in the Design Division is open to all amateur exhibitors who are members of Florida Federation of Garden Clubs, Inc., (FFGC). Competition in the Horticulture and Botanical Arts Division (Photography) is open to amateur exhibitors in Florida.
- 4. Design entries registration will be in advance, prior to October 4, 2018. Design entry forms can be found on the SGC website, http://www.sarasotagardenclub.org, and submitted to Chair: Sara Bagley, 941-923-5074, sabags@aol.com.
- 5. Design entries will be accepted at the Sarasota Garden Club, 1131 Boulevard of the Arts, Sarasota, FL 34236-4809, Thursday, October 11, 2018, 1:00 pm to 3:00 pm and Friday, October 12, 2018, from 9:00 am to 10:30 am, and should be refreshed on Saturday, October 13, prior to show opening.
- 6. An exhibitor may enter multiple classes within the Design Division, but only one (1) exhibit per class.
- Horticulture entries registration will be in advance, prior to October 4, 2018. Horticulture entry forms can be found on the SGC website, http://www.sarasotagardenclub.org, and submitted to Chair: Dianne Beaver, 941-780-2949, diannebeaver@gmail.com.
- 8. Printed entry cards will be available for pick-up on October 8, 2018, between 9:00 am and 12:00 pm, or on October 9, 2018, between 9:00 am and 10:30 am at the Sarasota Garden Club.
- All horticulture entries will be accepted at the Sarasota Garden Club, 1131 Boulevard of the Arts, Sarasota, FL 34236-4809, Thursday, October 11, 2018, 1:00 pm to 3:00 pm, except cut entries which will be accepted Friday, October 12, 2018, from 9:00 am to 10:30 am.
- 10. Horticulture entries will be staged on 6' or 8' tables, 30" wide, 29" high, draped with a black cloth and set in front of open windows or off-white vertical blinds.
- 11. Each exhibitor is limited to one (1) entry per class in each Division, except in the Horticulture Division.
- 12. All entries and entry tags will be checked by the Classification Committee before being placed in the exhibition area.
- 13. All exhibits must be removed between 4:00 and 4:30 pm on Saturday, October 13, 2018.
- 14. The Classification Chairman for each division is to check each exhibit for conformity to the schedule prior to judging. Final determination for conformance is the judges' responsibility.
- 15. Judging will begin at 12:30 pm on Friday, October 12, 2018. The General Chairman and the Classification Chairman for each division are to be available during the judging for possible consultation. They, along with the judges and clerks, are the only personnel allowed on the floor during judging.
- 16. The decisions of the judges are final. Awards may be withheld if not merited.
- 17. The Sarasota Garden Club will strive to assure the safety of all items after arrival and placement but is not responsible for any loss or damage to exhibits.
- 18. Native plants may be entered provided such plants have been legally obtained and grown by the exhibitor for at least three (3) months. Reference: http://edis.ifas.ufl.edu/topic\_native\_plants
- 19. The use of plant material classified as Federal Noxious Weeds is prohibited. Reference: http://www.aphis.usda.gov/plant\_health/plant\_pest\_info/weeds/downloads/weedlist.pdf
- 20. The use of plant material on Florida's Federally Listed Plants as endangered or threatened is prohibited. Reference: http://plants.usda.gov/java/threat?statelist=states&stateSelect=US12



## Standard System of Awarding

The National Garden Club (NGC) Standard System of Awarding is used in all Divisions. It

- Encourages uniform standard of judging
- Ensures fair and objective evaluation of all exhibits
- Ensures no criteria are overlooked
- Compares relative importance of qualities

Only 1 First place (blue) ribbon per class or sub-class; must score 90 points or more.

Only 1 Second place (red) ribbon per class or sub-class; must score 85 points or more.

Only 1 Third place (yellow) ribbon per class or sub-class; must score 80 points or more.

1 or more Honorable Mention (white) ribbons, as merited; must score 75 points or more.

Award must be withheld if the exhibit does not meet the point value for the ribbon. Entry cards of Blue ribbons and 90+ exhibits must be signed and dated by an NGC Accredited Judge on the panel. All other entry cards must be initialed by an Accredited Judge or Student Judge on the judging panel. Top Exhibitor award rosettes must be signed on the back by an NGC Accredited Judge who judged the class. *HB* pg. 6.

Awards may be withheld if not merited.

Small rosette of blue and white ribbons May be offered to the most outstanding petite design in a show of otherwise full-sized designs One (1) awarded in SECTION B (Classes 4, 5, 6)

Table artistry award HB pg. 43

Rosette of burgundy ribbons Designer's choice of fresh and/or dried plant material One (1) awarded in SECTION C (Classes 7, 8, 9)

## DIVISION I – Design "Pirates on the figh Seas" Design Rules

1. All General Rules apply.

2. The National Garden Clubs' Standard System of Awarding will be used. The Scale of Points for Design is listed in the *Handbook for Flower Shows*, *HB* pg.130.

3. The NGC Exhibit Policies are printed in the *HB* Chapter 7, Exhibiting in the Design Division, NGC Policies and Guidelines.

4. Design entries registration will be in advance, prior to October 4, 2018, and entry forms can be found on the SGC website, http://www.sarasotagardenclub.org, and submitted to Chair: Sara Bagley, 941-923-5074, sabags@aol.com. Design entries will be accepted at Sarasota Garden Club, 1131 Blvd. of the Arts,

Sarasota, FL 34236-4809, Thursday, October 11, 2018, 1:00 pm to 3:00 pm and Friday,

October 12, 2018, from 9:00 am to 10:30 am and should be refreshed on Saturday, October 13, 2018, prior to show opening.

5. Plant material and non-plant material permitted and not permitted in the Design Division are printed in the *HB* Chapter 7.

6. All plant material used in the design must be identified on a 3" X 5" index card, provided by the committee and included with the entry tag.

7. The exhibitor is required to conform to the stated description and limitations of the Design Type, if named in the class.

8. Rules for Design Types, Advanced Design Types, Table Designs and Table Appointments are printed in the *HB* Chapter 7.

9. The Scale of Points for Design is listed in the HB Chapter 14

10. The exhibitor has the freedom to choose Traditional or Creative Style with any design listed, unless restricted by the Flower Show Schedule. Design must be approved for conformance and classification by the Design Section Entries/Classification Chairman, before the exhibitor leaves the show area. Exhibitors are expected to maintain their exhibits for the duration of the show.

11. Design entries will be accepted Thursday, October 11, 2018, 1:00 pm to 3:00 pm, and Friday, October 12, 2018, from 9:00 am to 10:30 am, and should be refreshed on Saturday, October 13, prior to show opening, at 9:00 am.

12. Exhibitors must remove all entries on Saturday, October 13, 2018, between 4:00 pm and 4:30 pm.

13. Some plant material must be used in every exhibit. This includes fresh and/or dried plant material. Plant material need not be grown by exhibitor.

14. An exhibitor may enter multiple classes within the Design Division, but only 1 exhibit per class.

15. The exhibit entered into competition must be the work of only 1 exhibitor and that exhibitor's name must appear on the entry tag.

16. If an exhibitor is unable to fulfill their assignment, it is her/his responsibility to find a replacement.

17. The American flag and other national flags are not permitted in the Design Division.

## Class 1 "Booty on the Briny"

An Underwater design staged on an acrylic cube 18" square by 40" tall, set in front of a draped white linen curtain. Frame of reference is 18" by 18".

## Class 2 "Walking the Plank"

A Cascade design staged on 1/2 of a 6' table, 29" high. Frame of reference is 36" wide and 30" deep. Background will be off-white wall or draped with white linen curtain. Table will be draped to the floor with a black fabric.

## Class 3 "Shiver Me Timbers"

A Creative design staged on 1/2 of a 6' table, 29" high. Frame of reference is 36" wide and 30" deep. Background will be a pipe and drape of white fabric. Table will be draped to the floor with black fabric.

## Section B. "Blimey"

Eligible for (1) NGC Petite Award, HB pg. 43 Eligible for one (1) SGC Christy Payne Bowl Award Designer has complete freedom to choose plant material and other components. 4 entries per class

## Class 4 "Thar She Blows"

A 12" Multi Rhythmic design staged in an off-white niche 14" high and 42" from the floor. Frame of reference is a pie-shaped space 18" across front, 14" deep to niche, niche 14" high.

## Class 5 "Pieces of Eight"

An 8" Reflective design staged in an off-white niche 10" high and 42" from the floor. Frame of reference is a pie-shaped space 18" across front, 14" deep to niche, niche 14" high.

## Class 6 "Salty Swashbuchler"

A 5" Creative design staged on top of a natural wood treasure chest 5" long, 3" wide and 2 3/4" tall with a 1" wide flat surface on the top. Treasure chest is a light brown in color and placed in an off-white niche 10" high and 42" from the floor. Frame of reference is a pie-shaped space 18" across front, 14" deep to niche, niche 14" high.

## Section C. "Shipwrecked"

Eligible for one (1) NGC Table Artistry Award, *HB* pg. 43 Eligible for one (1) Azalea Circle Silver Pitcher Award Designer has complete freedom to choose plant material and other components. 4 entries per class

## Class 7 "Marooned Matey"

Tray for 1 staged on TV table 15½" by 22½" by 25½" high. Tables are set free standing in room with no background. Designer to provide tray. Frame of reference is limited to 16" by 23".

### Class 8 "Treasure Island"

An exhibition table with plant material as needed for overall design, staged on 1/2 of a 6' table, 29" high. Background will be a pipe and drape of white fabric, and table draped in black fabric to the floor. Frame of reference is 36" wide and 30" deep.

## Class 9 "Lo ho ho and a Bottle of Rum"

An Al Fresco table for 2, staged on a brown wooden barrel with a black top of 23" diameter, 30" from the floor. Barrels are free-standing in room with no background. Frame of reference is 23" diameter circle.



## DIVISION II – Horticulture "Pirates and the Flower Invasion" Horticulture Rules

- 2. The National Garden Clubs' Standard System of Awarding will be used. The Scales of Points for Horticulture are located in the *Handbook for Flower Shows*, *HB* pgs. 129, 130.
- 3. The rules for a single species cut or container-grown specimen are listed in the *HB* pgs. 58, 59, or its supplement, *Horticulture Exhibiting and Judging*.
- 4. The NGC Exhibit Policies are printed in the *HB* pg. 55.
- 5. In order to receive an NGC Top Exhibitor Award, the exhibitor must identify her/his entry by its binomial name or currently acceptable scientific designation. Consult *HB* Exhibiting in the Horticulture Division, Chapter 6.

- 6. Horticulture registration will be in advance, prior to Thursday, October 4, 2018. Horticulture entry forms can be found at the SGC website, http://www.sarasotagardenclub.org, or via email, and submitted to Chair: Dianne Beaver, diannebeaver@gmail.com.
- 7. Printed entry cards will be available for pick-up on October 8, 2018, between 9:00 am and 12:00 pm, or on October 9, 2018, between 9:00 am and 10:30 am at Sarasota Garden Club. All horticulture entries will be accepted at the Sarasota Garden Club, 1131 Boulevard of the Arts, Sarasota, FL 34236
- 8. Exhibitors <u>must</u> remove all entries on Saturday, October 13, 2018, between 4:00 pm and 4:30 pm.
- 9. All plant material must be fresh and grown by the exhibitor.
- 10. Cut specimens should not have foliage below the water line, except for *Gladiolus*.
- 11. If a plant is considered a flowering plant, it should be exhibited as a flowering specimen. Foliage plants may flower but should be exhibited as foliage plants if they are grown for their leaves.
- 12. Specimens with a class designation in the schedule may not be entered in the 'Any Other Worthy' class.
- 13. The Horticulture Classification Committee Chairman and/or General Show Chairman are free to subdivide classes by color, form, size, cultivar, variety or other distinguishing characteristics.
- 14. Container grown plants must have been in the possession of the exhibitor for no fewer than 90 days. Exceptions, with no minimum, are early maturing seeds/transplants and forced bulbs/corms/tubers/rhizomes. Cut specimens must have been cared for as a mature plant for at least 90 days. Arboreals (woody ornamentals) must have been in the exhibitor's possession for 6 months. HB pg. 55.
- 15. All entries are to be labeled by genus, specific epithet and variety/cultivar or patented/trademarked names. Common names may also be given.
- 16. All entries and entry tags will be checked by the Classification Committee before being placed in the exhibition area.
- 17. The Scales of Points for Horticulture are located in the *HB* Chapter 14.
- 18. The Sarasota Garden Club will furnish clear containers for cut specimens.
- 19. The Sarasota Garden Club will furnish clear plastic wedging for cut specimens.
- 20. Horticulture specimens must be of superior quality and well groomed. Exhibits of inferior quality or not conforming to the schedule will be disqualified.
- 21. Only 1 plant per pot is permitted, except where schedule permits. Plants that grow naturally with multiple stems will be considered 1 plant.
- 22. Double potting and staking are allowed. Inner pot must not be visible and staking must be unobtrusive.
- 23. Exhibitor may make more than one entry per class or subclass, if each is a different genus, species, variety, cultivar, type, form, size, or color.
- 24. Plant material may not be altered by the application (treatment) of oil, commercial "shine" products, etc. that may artificially change the natural color and texture.
- 25. Horticulture exhibits will be staged on 6' and 8' tables draped with black cloths to the floor.

- 8. Photographs must be 11" X 14", matted with a 16" X 20" black mat provided by committee. No frames or glass allowed.
- 9. Photographs will be staged in the hallway, on an off-white painted wall to be viewed at a comfortable height.
- 10. Each entry must be labeled on the back of a mounting board, if used, or the back of the photo, in the lower right-hand corner, with information as specified on the entry form.
